We invite you onboard the **Sophian Cruise** - a look back at the cherished moments and accomplishments of the Sophian family, collated with utmost assiduity.



CHRISTMAS SYMBOLS MAKING COMPETITION CHRISTMAS CHEER EVERYWHERE (December 16, 2020)


Crib making, Christmas tree decoration,

(August 15, 2020)



'If the country is to be corruption free and become a nation of beautiful minds, I strongly feel there are three strong societal members who can make a difference.



MAKE IT A DECEMBER TO REMEBER



May the true spirit of patriotism brighten the heart of every citizen!




FELICITATING THE FINEST

but yet nobody called him by his mother's name.









Self - Love




Just breathing and living in the moment. You got this. Try to be yourself for one moment and maybe you will find the true meaning of your existence.

Stop and stay. Stop trying to look past the smoke, fog and haze.










The word 'Safety' will be lost in the darkness of dangers,




