A.1 Animals move from one place to another in search of food, water and shelter. They also move to protect themselves from their enemies.



Q.2 How do animals and plants feel changes around them?

A.2 We feel changes around us with the help of our five sense organs- eyes, nose, ears, tongue and skin. Insects such as cockroaches have feelers that help them to feel. Plants feel the warmth of sunlight and grow towards it.

Q.5 What is reproduction? How do living things reproduce?

A.5 The process by which living things produce more of their own kind is called reproduction. Some living things give birth to babies while some living things lay eggs from which the babies hatch out. Plants produce new plants from their seeds, stems and roots.
